In 1998, Nilai University welcomed the first batch of students pursuing the Diploma in Aircraft Maintenance Engineering. Later, an Advanced Diploma in Aircraft Engineering Technology was included as a direct tertiary pathway. Many cohorts have graduated, and some have achieved great heights in their careers. A decade has passed, and these qualifications are still well-received by key players in the industry.

Now, Nilai University has plans to offer a Bachelor Degree with honours specialising in Aircraft Maintenance Technology in 2020. The department of Aircraft Maintenance Engineering designed this programme after consulting local industry experts and Kingston University, in the United Kingdom. Following industry standards, we crafted the programme structure, especially for students intending a professional career in the fields related to Aircraft Maintenance Engineering, Aircraft System Engineering and Airline Management.

June 2019, was yet another memorable milestone. Nilai University signed a pact with the Philippines State College of Aeronautics (PhilSCA), one of the top aviation schools in the Philippines. The MoU signifies a collaboration to develop a Training Service Agreement in Aircraft Maintenance and Aviation Science.

Our efforts to promote Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) did not stop here. Further initiatives were undertaken to collaborate and network with higher learning institutions and schools. We aspire to inculcate a research-culture among the academicians at the University. In view of this, Nilai University teamed-up with like-minded universities in Research and Innovation in Private Higher Education Network (RIPHEN).

Nilai University has also signed an academic collaboration with Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan Seksyen 24 (2), Shah Alam, to promote an alternative tertiary academic pathway in Gerontology and Geriatric Services. Another school under Nilai University's wing is Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan Bandar Seri Putra. Here, the School of Accounting and Finance fostered a collaboration to promote interest in accounting and finance, as a professional career option.

Maintaining the scale of a balanced learning environment, Nilai University organised the 1st KPM-PST Nilai University Fencing Open Championship 2019, where over a hundred men and women participants displayed an array of competitive fencing tactics with great sportsmanship.

Throughout 2019, Nilai University has extended full and partial scholarships to students from all walks of life. Over a hundred students have received scholarships to pursue their desired programme of choice in the various specialised fields of business and science. These scholarships are their first step to gain mastery of a specialised field.

For over 20 years, Nilai University has extended scholarships to many students. Some students were academically inclined, while others were talented sportsmen/ women, or gifted leaders of societies and clubs in their schools. We have also offered scholarships and free accommodation to some students from B40 families.

Indeed, these students and their families welcomed the scholarly opportunity. Thus, I pray that this gesture of good fortune would continue and in turn, our students would choose a life of contribution to others in need.



# Honouring Nurses Around The World.

Each year, around the world, International Nurses' Day is celebrated on 12th May. Besides honouring the selfless contribution of nurses, it is also the birth anniversary of Florence Nightingale-the founder of modern nursing. The International Council of Nurses (ICN) sets a theme - "A Voice to Lead; Health for all" for this year's Nurses' Day.

The world acknowledges nursing as a noble profession, requiring extraordinary resilience and dedication. Nurses are ordinary people dedicating their lives to an extraordinary cause.

The Nursing Students Association (NSA) at Nilai University organised Nurses' Day with a 3-day Health Promotional Campaign on 24th July 2019. Forty-two students and two counsellors from Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan (SMK) Dato' Mohd Said, Nilai participated for half a day. They took part in the outdoor games; health talks organised with Lembaga Penduduk Dan Pembangunan Keluarga Negara (LPPKN) and a career talk in nursing. Our academic advisor, Pn. Siti Awa Abu Bakar, who is lecturing in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia was the speaker.

Also, NSA arranged various practical activities to demonstrate the professional skills required in nursing. Later during the day, NSA gathered students into groups to showcase their talent. It set the tone for a light moment, where students and staff shared a few laughs, cackles and giggles.

Our campaign partners, HPC offered Body Mass Index (BMI), and blood pressure measurements and LPPKN offered health screening. They conducted tests on the spot: cholesterol and glucose testing (for a small fee), free HPV vaccination, and HPV/DNA testing. Participants also received vouchers for mammograms. About a hundred staff and students tried out the Ceragem massage bed.

Akademi Memandu Nilai promoted further awareness on road safety and the regulatory need for a driving license. Healthy beverages, including fresh milk from Farm Fresh, were on sale.

Some nursing students worked together with members of the Board Games Club, to arrange for several games. Participants had a go in Congkak, Batu Selemban, Twister, Jenga and many more.

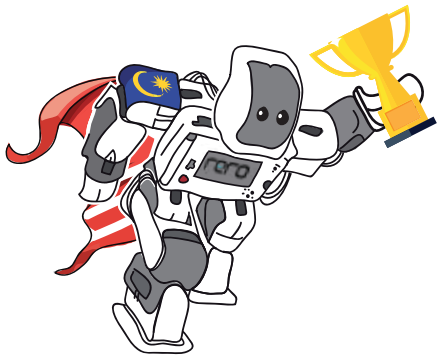

# Nilai University Hosts RAC19 NATIONAL LEVEL

## RERO ROBOTICS AND CODING COMPETITION



RERO ROBOTICS AND CODING COMPETITION - A two-day event was jointly organised by Nilai University and Cytron Technologies, a Penang-based company that designs and manufactures educational robotics kits. Endorsed by the Ministry of Education, this competition was a joint public-private-academia initiative in support of MDEC #mydigitalmaker movement which aims to transform Malaysian youth from digital users to producers in the digital economy.

This competition received an overwhelming response. A total of 288 teams from primary and secondary schools nationwide participated in the National Level RERO Robotics and Coding Competition (RAC19) held at Nilai University.

The Faculty of Engineering, Science and Technology (FEST) at Nilai University fully supports the nation's Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) initiatives in introducing robotics and coding. These are essential skills to prepare students for careers in STEM fields such as engineers, technologists, scientists, computer analysts, doctors and medical specialists. The students must be ready for upcoming automation where new jobs requiring programming skills will be created.

The competition was attended by more than a thousand people. Thirty students from FEST, Nilai University, volunteered in providing guidance and leadership to the junior participants. The students had the opportunity to establish further networks within the industry.

On the first day, 97 primary school teams competed in Live Coding Challenge with Rero:micro category and 43 secondary school teams contested in Live Coding Challenge with Rero Jr category. Another 148 secondary school teams competed in Live Coding Challenge with Rero:micro category on the second day.

During the competition, participants were required to program their robots on the spot to complete a set of tasks. In the preliminary round, they were assigned five coding tasks at increasing levels of difficulty. For the finals, qualifying teams were further challenged to solve other more challenging programming tasks plus math equations. Winners were determined based on successful completion of each task.

Out of 97 participating teams that took part in the Live Coding Challenge with Rero:micro (Primary) category, two teams from SJK(C) Connaught, KL, bagged both championship title and First runner-up, while the 2nd runner-up title went to SJK(C) Chung Hua No.1 team from Sarawak.

The champion team for Live Coding Challenge with Rero Jr (Secondary) category came from MasterMind Educational Centre, Johor. Teams from SMK Tinggi Batu Pahat, Johor secured both the 1st runner-up and 2nd runner-up titles in this category.

The team from Sekolah Seri Cahaya, a private school in Shah Alam, emerged as champion in the Live Coding Challenge with Rero:micro (Secondary) category, followed by teams from SMK Datuk Patinggi Haji Abdul Gapor, Sarawak (1st runner up) and SMK Tun Abdul Razak, Sarawak (2nd runner up).

Nilai University is actively committed to organise various community projects with other higher learning institutions and corporations to promote STEM education among primary and secondary school students.

# Workshops for ACADEMIA

The School of Applied Sciences in collaboration with the Quality, Audit and Learning Resources (QALR) and Centre for Research and Postgraduate Studies (CRPS) organised two academic workshops in April 2019.

The first entitled **COMMON MISTAKES MADE BY POSTGRADUATE CANDIDATES** was held on 23rd April 2019. Prof. Dr Norzaidi Bin Hj. Mohd Daud, Chairman, Community of Research, Institute of Research Management and Innovation (IRMI), Universiti Teknologi MARA, Shah Alam, Selangor, Malaysia delivered his talk in two sessions. He started with the topic on Basic Research vs Applied Research and subsequently followed through with Issues vs Problems and Problems vs Gaps in Knowledge.

His enthusiasm for this topic was contagious, and he took the opportunity to highlight related problems faced by postgraduate students and outlined meaningful strategies to confront and overcome these pitfalls. A more in-depth explanation of these tips is detailed in his recent publication entitled "Tips-tips Lulus PhD".



The second, a half-day workshop; **HOW TO GRADUATE ON TIME** was held on 24th April, 2019 at the auditorium, Nilai University. Prof Ir Dr Ramli Nazir, Senior Deputy Director, Centre for Tropical Geoengineering, Universiti Teknologi Malaysia, spoke on the importance of time management and staying focused. If one wishes to complete a postgraduate study on-time, these are points to consider.

We were pleased to hear that these workshops were beneficial to participants pursuing postgraduate qualifications. It contributed significantly to understanding the research component of academia.





# Tourism Sustainability and Responsible Tourism in the 21st Century



The School of Hospitality and Tourism held its third Hospitality Symposium entitled Tourism Sustainability and Responsible Tourism in the 21st Century. This event was held on 8th August 2019. The objective of the symposium was to provide a learning platform for staff and students to engage in research.

Research students undertaking the class on *Issues in International Hospitality and Tourism Management* for the final year B.A. (Hons) in Business and Hospitality Management, took this opportunity to showcase their research papers. Participants included academicians (Taylors University, UCSI University, UTIM) and, general managers from hotels, trainers for tour operators and students and lecturers from Nilai University.

Every symposium includes a thought-provoking and eye-opening talk by a renowned academician and researcher with expertise in Sustainable Tourism. For this third Hospitality Symposium, it was a great privilege to have Prof. Dr Vikneswaran Nair from The Bahamas. Professor Dr Vikneswaran is the current Dean of Graduate Studies and Research, from the University of The Bahamas. Dr Vikneswaran is a Full Professor of Sustainable Tourism with extensive experience in local and international research and consultancy engagements contributing to over 350 publications.

His lecture entitled “*Sustainable and Responsible Tourism in the 21st Century: The Bahamas experience*” was enlightening. This opportunity was made possible through Nilai University’s active membership in Tourism Educators Association of Malaysia (TEAM).

There were five papers presented during the symposium that covered every area of hospitality and tourism, namely food and beverage, events, travel agency and island resort sustainability. In particular, a paper entitled “*The Socio-cultural Factors That Impact the Sustainability of Fast Food Restaurant Development in Malaysia*” impressed the participants. Later, it led to an exciting exchange of ideas and further research opportunities. This paper was submitted to the International Journal of Tourism Research, “*Special Issue on Contemporary Issues And Future Trends In Food Tourism.*”

The event was held in conjunction with the Tourism Educators Association Malaysia Annual General Meeting (TEAM). The president of TEAM, Dr Mohd. Hafiz bin Mohd Hanaifah from University



Technology MARA (UiTM), Selangor and his team of lecturers participated in the AGM. Committee members included academicians and industry partners from Biz Group of Hotels and Association of Tourism Training Institutes in Malaysia (ATTIM). Overall this was a successful event. The Diploma of Hotel Management students tirelessly organised and coordinated this symposium with the guidance of their lecturers.

# Visitors from University of Miyazaki

On the 19th of September 2019, a group of students and their 'Sensei' (teacher) from the University of Miyazaki, Japan, visited Nilai University campus. # Asas Sains Komputer Workshop

On 25 September 2019, the School of Computing conducted a workshop, entitled "Asas Sains Komputer" for thirty three Form 3 students from SMK Taman Semarak, Nilai. This is an initial effort of Nilai University to nurture and cultivate young talents in Information Technology specifically for the School of Computing's adopted school. This workshop was organised by Ms Noor Zuhaili bt Md Yasin (Programme Coordinator, School of Computing) and Tuan Hj Asri Mohd Hasim (Panitia Asas Sains Komputer, SMK Taman Semarak, Nilai).

During this workshop, we taught on topics such as the Algorithm, Pseudo-Code, Flowchart, Sorting and Searching Techniques and Comparison of Sorting. Dr Abu Bakar Bin Mahat, Dean of the Faculty of Engineering Science and Technology, Puan Harlina Harun, Head, School of Computing, our colleagues from the computing department, and Mr Desmond Law, Marketing Dept rendered guidance and a helping hand in organising the "Asas Sains Komputer" workshop.

On 11th October, Nilai University hosted the 1st KPM-PST Nilai University Fencing Open Championship 2019. The 3-day competition was held at the President Hall, Nilai University. It was organised in collaboration with the Ministry of Education and Focus Centre Fencing (PST) of Nilai University.

I was elated to be selected as an emcee for this competition because it would be a favourable opportunity for me to sharpen my public speaking skills. This 1st KPM-PST Fencing Open Championship attracted over a hundred local and international fencers. During the event, Nilai University welcomed elite and excellent fencers from different countries, namely Thailand, Indonesia, India, Turkmenistan, and of course, Malaysia. Both men and women fencers competed in two categories under the three branches of fencing-sabre, epee and foil.

Sports Division, MOHE, accompanied by Mr Michael Yei, Organising Chairman & Director of Sports witnessed the Men's Epee match.

The Men's Epee was selected as a premier match because competitors moved as fast as lightning since the entire body is a legitimate target. # SEM-AMOS

## Quantitative Data Analysis Workshop

Structural Equation Modeling (SEM) is a statistical methodology widely used by researchers in the social and behavioral sciences. A workshop on SEM-AMOS Quantitative Data Analysis was conducted by Dr. Siti Aishah Hussin & Dr. Chandramalar Munusami on 21 August 2019.

This workshop was specifically designed for students or researchers who were keen to apply SEM methods in their research projects.

SEM is widely used by researchers to analyze the inter-relationships among constructs in a model. Participants were exposed to the concepts of SEM and received hands-on guides on how to execute SEM with AMOS software. Most importantly, participants learned to interpret the results accurately. This SEM-AMOS workshop would enable participants to analyze their measurement model and structural model.



# Expert Talk on Financial Technology (FINTECH) and Industrial Revolution 4.0 (IR 4.0)



The School of Accounting and Finance organised a day talk on Financial Technology (Fintech) and Industrial Revolution 4.0 (IR 4.0) on 14th August 2019. About 125 participants took part. The following objectives were established:

- 1 Create an awareness and develop an overview of the evolution of Fintech in Malaysia;
- 2 Instil in students and lecturers that technology and finance are inter-related;
- 3 Inform on the application of the blockchain.



The expert speakers Effendy Zulkify, CEO of Blockchain Academy Asia, Co-Founder of Block-work, Puvaneswari Subramaniam, CEO of QF4Tech Asia, Koh How Tze, Co-founder and President and Fazliq Lirfan, Crypto Forensic Expert, from Crypto Valley Malaysia shared their knowledge, expertise and experiences in Financial Technology.

Those who intended to venture and broaden their knowledge in this specialised field benefitted tremendously. Academicians gained further knowledge on the developments of FinTech, which is transforming the financial services, blockchain and distributed ledger technology, the forefront of this revolution. The Wall Street Journal and The Economist have described it as a technology that could change the world. Blockchain offers banks, asset managers and other organisations the potential to achieve considerable cost savings, efficiencies and resilience with their payment and payment execution systems. These are developments that no senior executive can afford to ignore. Gaining a foothold at this early stage is vital in shaping the technology strategies of the future.

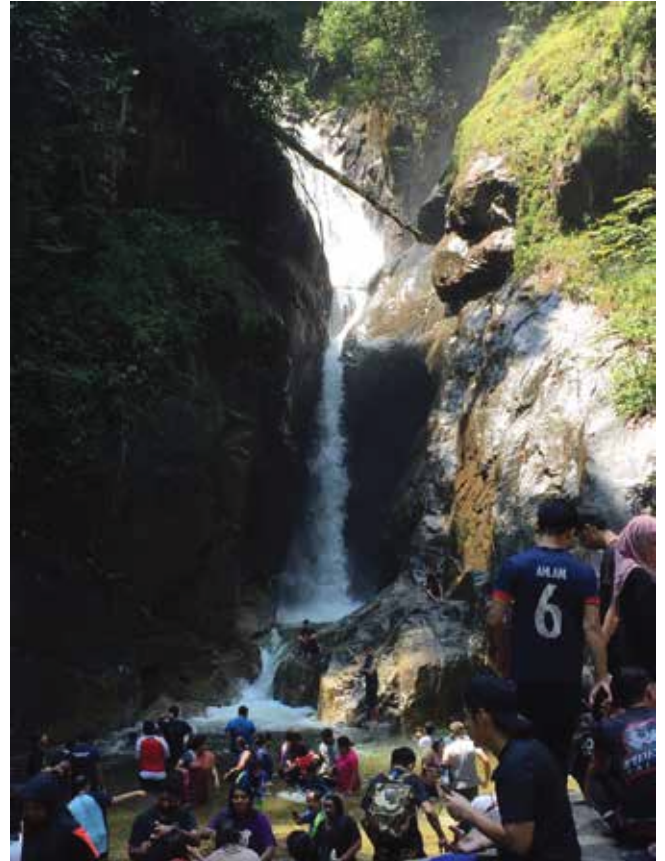




# Fostering TEAMWORK

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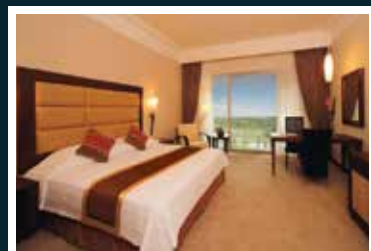
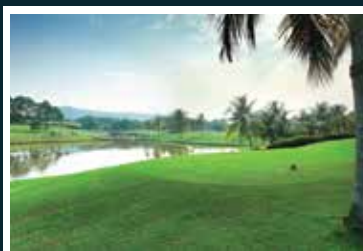
